

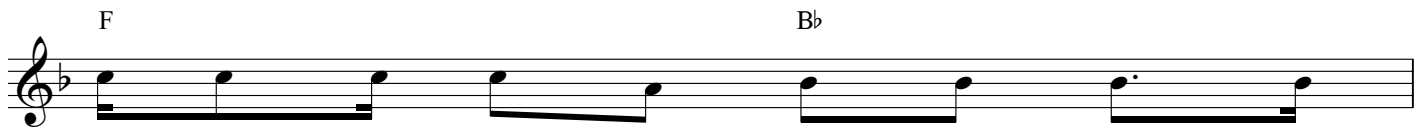

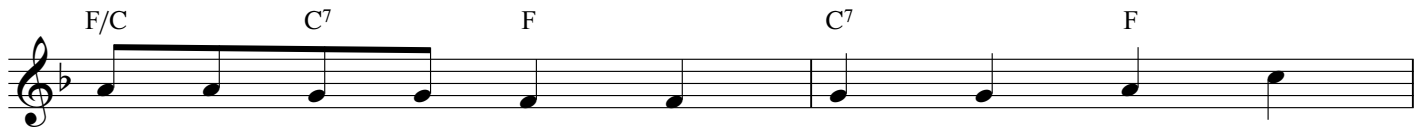
The Fox went out on a chil - ly night, And he
